

Longwood Gardens Teen Art Contest 2022

Longwood Gardens is hosting a Teen Art Contest! Longwood Gardens asks you to create an original artwork depicting a tree; either real or from your imagination inspired by the book Canopy Career Chronicles and the theme of trees. The contest will be from February 1st- 25th at 5 p.m. The local library winners will be announced March 12th! Winners will receive a sketch pad and pencil kit, a ticket for up to 4 people for entry to Longwood gardens, and their artwork displayed at Rose Tree Park and part of the annual Poetry Contest Anthology. Artwork will be accepted in-person and online at

www.delcolibraries.org/Teen-Art-Contest. There are also a few rules shown below.

- Students in 6th-12th grade are encouraged to submit artwork to their local library or on-line at www.delcolibraries.org/Teen-Art-Contest from February 1st through February 25th at 5 p.m.
- All artwork should be inspired by The Longwood Garden Community Read book Canopy Career Chronicles and the theme of trees.
- Entries must be an original artwork depicting a tree(s); either real or from the student's imagination.
- Entries may be hand drawn or painted. No photography or 3D.
- Original artwork must be 9x12 or smaller. (If submitted electronically, we will print it out at 8 1/2 x 11)
- For in person drop-off: The student's name, email and grade should be written on the back of the artwork with the completed entry form attached. All electronic submissions should be submitted here: www.delcolibraries.org/Teen-Art-Contest.
- Only one artwork per person may be submitted. Artwork must be original with no copyrighted material. All artwork must be appropriate for view by the general public, including children.
- DCL reserves the right to photocopy, scan, photograph, and video artwork as well as photograph and video artists for use on our website, social media and StoryWalk® and invites other media to do the same.
