Mobile App

Delaware County Library System now has a mobile app! You can do a variety of things on the app. From searching our catalog to managing your record, there’s so much you can do. It’s like having the library at your fingertips. A brand new feature that we’re offering on the app is Self Checkout! You can pick up any book you want, scan it in the app, and go. You can also sign up for a library card in the app if you don’t already have one! To try out these new features, download it today in the App Store or Google Play- search for **DelcoReads**. Need

Resources

Our library offers a lot of resources! We have offered many museum passes in the past. Check out our website to see which passes we offer. We are also now offering mobile hotspots and iPads! The library has three hotspots and four iPads, all with their own theme. Ask a staff member at the desk to see if any of these awesome resources are available. Delaware County Libraries also offers multiple online resources. One of the great resources we offer is Libby. Libby is an amazing app that can be used to read books or listen to audiobooks on your phone, nook, ipad, or computer. These books are just like getting a book from the library. You'll be able to borrow the book for three weeks to read and enjoy. Sometimes you might even get the book faster on Libby than a physical copy! You can borrow from any of the 26 libraries in our system. Also, thanks to the generous donation from the Library Foundation of Delaware County, Norwood Library is able to add new eBooks and audiobooks to our collection on Libby. Be on the lookout for those new titles!
